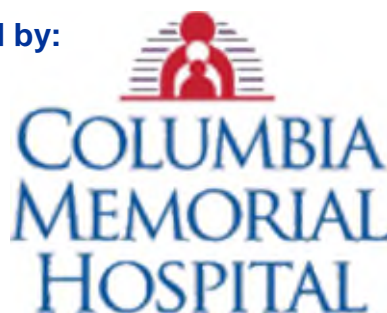

Course Description:

This one day conference is designed to provide healthcare providers with the latest information on pediatric care. Participants will gain practical knowledge from expert providers in the care of ill children.

Desired Outcomes

- Describe established and novel applications of the initial care and assessment of pediatric patients including the baseline assessment, age and developmentally appropriate techniques and methods to gain cooperation, and expected assessment parameters.
- Recognize the differences between the pediatric and adult patient in terms of compensatory mechanisms, length of respiratory compensation, and indications for intubation.
- Review best practice guidelines of pediatric post-operative pain management with a focus on front line medications, dosing and dosing schedules, and managing pain.
- Update & discuss areas of controversy or change in the current bronchiolitis management guidelines.
- Increase awareness of evidence-based management of needle and minor procedural pain in the pediatric patient.
- Demonstrate the fundamental skills associated with pediatric advance life support, bolusing techniques and emergency medication dosage calculation and administration.
