Cancer care support, such as art therapy, healing gardens, exercise programs, new technology and comfort items

New **medical equipment**, including a hearing screener and vision screener for premature newborns, neuro-spine surgical imaging systems and an upright breast biopsy system

Hospice support, from in-home respite care, bereavement programs and interpretive services, to comfort care items and activities

Programs and new equipment at the **Legacy Oregon Burn Center**, such as a virtual reality system to alleviate pain during treatment, pressure garments for outpatients, and sponsoring 150 children, teens and young adults to attend burn survivor camps
