

Clinical Integration Education Requirement Update

Effective 2026

Legacy Health Partners (LHP) has retired the formerly required **Clinical Integration (CI) Education video**. Providers are **no longer required** to complete an annual CI education activity to qualify for their earned incentive.

What Changed?

Beginning in 2026 and moving forward, the LHP Board of Managers and the Quality & Membership Committee determined to retire the required CI Education video. While this education played an important role during LHP's formative years, the requirement has been formally retired to reduce administrative burden and tracking for practices.

What This Means for Practices

Practices **do not need to:**

- Track provider completion of CI education activities
- Remind providers to complete required learning modules or videos

There are no required education activities tied to eligibility for the Clinical Integration incentive program.

What's Staying the Same

LHP will continue to offer a variety of optional learning and engagement opportunities, including clinical collaboration events, educational videos, and health equity learning activities. These resources are available through LHP's existing channels and participation is completely voluntary.

How participation in continued learning will be incentivized

Provider incentives are earned based on overall performance in the Clinical Integration program. Providers who choose to participate in optional LHP learning opportunities can earn a higher portion of funds in the Citizenship Category within the incentive model, which represents a small subset of the overall incentive fund.

Changes to Clinical Integration Education Requirement and Incentive Eligibility

1. Which requirement has changed?

LHP retired the annual Clinical Integration (CI) Education video, which was formerly required for providers to be eligible to earn any incentive in the CI Program.

2. Do I have to complete any education to earn an incentive from the Clinical Integration Program?

No. There are no longer any educational activities required to be eligible to receive any earned incentive in the CI Program. Providers must still satisfy all other LHP membership and eligibility requirements.

3. Has something replaced the CI Education video?

No. Nothing has replaced it. The video requirement was removed without adding a new requirement.

4. Why did LHP make this change?

This update was recommended to:

- Reduce administrative burden
- Avoid one-size-fits-all requirements
- Keep the program fair across specialties and practice sizes
- Continue recognizing meaningful engagement without making it mandatory

5. Will LHP still offer learning and engagement opportunities?

Yes. LHP will continue to offer optional, role-relevant opportunities for learning, collaboration, and participation across the network.

6. Where can I find current opportunities?

LHP will continue to share opportunities through existing communication channels. Participation is always optional. Refer to [LHP's Video Library](#) for current opportunities.

7. If I complete an optional learning activity, does that contribute to my incentive earnings?

Since participation is encouraged but not required, every full member provider in LHP automatically begins the year with 1 point in the Citizenship category of the incentive model. Citizenship represents a small subset of the overall incentive fund¹. Scoring in that category now recognizes additional voluntary engagement as *Promoters*, such as:

- Optional LHP learning modules (maximum 1 credit per year)
- LHP Clinical Collaboration events (1 credit per topic)
- Legacy Health Equity Series topics (maximum 1 credit per year)
- Other LHP-led participation opportunities, as announced

Note that *Detractors* are built into the Citizenship scoring model and may subtract 1 point in limited situations. For example, if a practice does not submit requested supplemental clinical data needed for LHP performance measurement, a point may be deducted. We do not expect this to affect many providers since most practices already submit data when requested; this is intended to reinforce the importance of timely data sharing in a clinically integrated network.

8. What if I don't participate in any optional activities?

Providers will still receive any earned incentive based on their performance in the Clinical Integration program. Providers can earn funds in the Citizenship incentive category even if they do not complete any optional activities. However, providers who choose to participate in more of the activities mentioned above will earn a higher proportion of the citizenship category fund than those who do nothing.

9. Is participation tracked or reported differently?

No. LHP uses existing tracking for optional activities. Follow the instructions in the learning activity to mark it complete successfully, but you do not need to submit additional documentation or take extra steps. LHP will also utilize Continuing Medical Education (CME) completion reports for relevant activities and attendance reports from live events so attendees don't need to mark activities complete more than once.
